The Shorter Catechism is a statement of faith from the Presbyterian Church. It begins with:

Our spiritual formation begins with our willingness to say, “yes” to everything that will draw us closer to God.

We affirm the work of the Spirit through certain practices that make us more open and responsive to the Spirit's touch utilizing practices such as: sabbath keeping, works of compassion and justice, discernment, worship, hospitality, spiritual friendships and contemplative silence. *(This statement comes from the Presbyterian Church.)*

I invite you to join me in growing in your faith. Beginning in September, I anticipate three opportunities for adults to more fully develop their faith. We will have a study on Sunday morning prior to church. We will also have opportunities during the week for people to gather and grow together.

What are you doing to Glorify God? What can we do together that will aid you in your walk of life and faith?

Fast Track to Heaven

Well, my car was equipped with a brand new radiator and a new electric cooling fan, for the mere pittance of \$826.23, caused by my negligence in not acknowledging the intermittent noise coming from under the hood. (I refer you back to last Tiding's article.) It was as if my car was praying to be made well again and I, as the "Master of the Universe," disregarded its continued pleas and gnashing of teeth. Well, I know better for next time and I will be more aware of its needs. It is a grandiose thing that God, exhibiting infinite patience and wisdom, hears our cries for assistance although, at times, lets us find our own path to rectify our situation. Frequently, we aren't very happy about that, but at other times, it is a lesson worth learning and usually makes us stronger in our adoration of our Lord.

You might notice that I started this account with the past tense "was equipped." Yep, the saga continues: my car was brought back from the dead on Tuesday, April 26th. It was thrilling to have a set of wheels again and not have to walk everywhere (which, by the way, severely limits where you can go and what you could purchase and carry back home). Now, I could commute again.

I had an invitation to my sister's home the following Sunday, May 3rd. My girlfriend, Judy, was also invited and she and I graciously accepted. It was to be a "Cinco de Mayo" party. I happen to have an affinity for margaritas and mojitos and my brother-in-law can really mix a cocktail quite well, so I was actually looking forward to this affair. It just so happened that on that Sunday, I had time after service and before the party to bake a key lime pie. I adore key lime pie. It's my favorite.

To spend some time together before the party, Judy came over my apartment shortly after I had taken the pie out of the oven. She was grateful when she saw it because we could bring it to my sister's. We all know how embarrassing it is to go to someone's home empty handed. I laughed at this suggestion (I had made the pie for me!) because it was "only" my sister and her husband's house, but Judy was dead serious. I stated that it probably wouldn't be set by the time we had to leave, but she stood firm and I agreed to take it. I was also raised that it's impolite to accept an invitation to someone's home and not bring a token of appreciation, so I understood her line of reasoning, although it was still "just my sister."

I live in Belleville, my sister lives in Wood-ridge and Judy lives in Glen Rock. So, what does this have to do with anything? My sister's house is practically equal distance and in the middle of my home and Judy's home so Judy would drive her car there and I would drive mine. It made sense at the time so Judy wouldn't have to drive me back to my apartment since she was going to be closer to her home. (But now I would have to severely cut down on the libations!) I would take my car, she would take hers and then we could each go directly home after the party. We proceeded to Route 3 East, then to Route 17 North on our way to Wood-Ridge. At about the halfway point, my cell phone rang. It was Judy. (No, I wasn't holding it; the setting was on speaker phone.) She wasn't feeling that well and had decided just to continue home. Oh well, I'll grab a plate of some of my Mom's homemade cookies so that she can enjoy them at a later time. Judy continued on to Glen Rock and I went to Anna Maria's (my sister's) house in Wood-Ridge. Since Judy wasn't attending the party with me, I decided not to bring in the key lime pie. (I know, I'm a regular snake in the grass, but it's only my sister!) The pie was still warm, wasn't fully set yet and I really wanted to have it at home. So, I left it on the front seat and proceeded to have a good time at my sister's Cinco de Mayo Party. I only had one refreshing mojito because I was driving, but indulged in all sorts of Mexican epicurean delights! (How else do you think I keep this svelte figure?) I arranged a plate of my Mom's homemade cookies so that I can drop them off at Judy's at some point and departed the festivities at an early hour.

It was raining outside (what a surprise!) but I decided anyway to take the trek further north to Glen Rock so that Judy might be able to enjoy some cookies the following day. I left them on her covered porch (yes, they were wrapped quite well) and started the trek home to Belleville. I would call her later to tell her of the treats left by her portal. The most direct route to my home from Glen Rock is to travel on Route 20 South to Route 21 South. That was the way I went. By this time, it was literally pouring cats and dogs and visibility was quite poor but I've traveled this way many times over the past year, so I wasn't too concerned.

The southern bound junction of Route 20 to 21 can only be compared to a backwards C. There is a very sharp curve to the left that continues for about a quarter mile. The State Trooper exited his vehicle and worked his way towards me, just as a Clifton Police car arrived. The Clifton police officer handed me my detached license plate and they both asked if I was okay. I answered affirmatively. I told them that my key lime pie did not make it, however. They both looked puzzled. "Key lime pie?" they inquired, and so I opened the door to my vehicle and they peered inside. There was key lime pie all over the front of the car, including the now sagging air bags. They shook their heads in dismay and agreed. It was then that I noticed that I had key lime guts all over the right side of my pants. The pie, quite obviously, wasn't wearing a seat belt. (Even in its disheveled state, it looked good!)

So what does one get out of all of this? Where was God as all this was happening? Well, let me tell you. God was watching over me because, although my car was a total loss, I walked away with just a sore left cheek. Nobody else was hurt, as I didn't hit another vehicle. I also learned that because I was selfish and wouldn't share my precious key lime pie (knowing full well that my sister could have put it in her fridge and enjoyed it later), it was taken away from me and I didn't get to enjoy it either. After all, I could always have made another one. I wasn't being fair to Judy either as she thought I was bringing that pie to my sister's like I had agreed to do. I will share what I enjoy in the future.



Yes, God was watching me that night and protecting me. I am truly grateful for that. We do have a wonderful Lord. (I just wish a small piece of pie could have been saved for me!)
